Australian Awards Scholarships (AAS) – Intake for Academic Year 2020

The Government of Australia has invited applications from eligible government officials in Sri Lanka for the above scholarship programme for the academic year 2020.

The objective of the AAS is to enhance and strengthen the capacity of human resources in the public sector by providing valuable knowledge, skills and qualifications and thereby improving the quality services for the general public while enhancing the economic growth of Sri Lanka. Scholarships are awarded on condition that participants should actively engage in development activities of Sri Lanka.

Priority Sectors

The eligible applicants with experience and ability to contribute for the development in the sectors of economic development, good governance & gender equality will be considered for AAS.

- Scholarships in the priority sector of **Economic Development** included Agriculture Economics, Business Administration, Customs Administration, Development Economics, Economics, Educational Management, Fisheries and Aquatic Resources, Information and Communication Technologies, International Finance, International Trade, Maritime Studies, Mathematics, Tourism and Hospitality and Urban Planning.
- Scholarships in the Good Governance sector included Development Studies,
 Disability Studies, Finance, Forensic Science, Human Resource Management,
 Humanitarian and Disaster Management, Law, Political Economy, Political
 Science, Project Management, Public Administration, Public Policy and
 Statistics.

• Scholarships in the priority sector of **Gender Equality** included Economics, Gender Studies, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology.

AAS has been focused to enhance the individual candidate's decision making ability by way of providing wide range of knowledge and skills through their Master' Programme, so that they can use them for the economic and social development of the country. However, this depends on the commitments and the well performance of the candidate. Therefore, you are kindly requested to nominate well qualified and committed personal who can acquire wider knowledge and benefits from this programme and make use of them for the development of the country in an effective manner. It is also necessary to ensure that the development plans are implemented by them upon their return.

Eligibility Criteria

Australia Awards applicants must meet all eligibility requirements detailed in the Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook, available at: http://aid.dfat.gov.au/Publications/Pages/scholarhandbook.aspx

In addition to these basic eligibility requirements, applicants must also meet the following country specific conditions.

- be a citizen of Sri Lanka
- They must not have previously received any Sri Lankan or overseas government-funded award (including Australian Government scholarships) for long-term academic studies in a foreign country. Long-term academic studies are defined as one year or longer in duration.
- An IELTS (Academic) overall score of at least 6.5 with no band less than 6.0 or an internet-based TOEFL (TOEFL iBT) score of at least 79, with a minimum of 21 in all subtests, or a Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE Academic) overall score of 58, with no communicative skill score less than 50. Scores must be valid at 1st January 2020.
- Applicants working in the districts below and applicants with a disability or those working in the disability sector will be considered with an overall IELTS band score of at least 6.0 with no band less than 5.0 (or equivalent TOEFL or PTE score). However, they must meet the English language requirements of their course, if offered an Australia Awards Scholarship.

- They must be employed in the public sector, and following criteria must be confirmed by an employment letter. (see*** in table of supporting documents below)
- They must have at least 3 years post qualification experience in the public sector with 2 years in a field relevant to the proposed course of study and be confirmed in their current positions.
- They must have an academic or professional background relevant to their proposed study programme.
- They must not be married, engaged to, or a de facto of a person who holds, or is eligible to hold, Australia or New Zealand citizenship or permanent residency, at any time during the application, selection or mobilization phases.
- They must not be currently serving military personnel.
- They must not be a citizen of Australia, hold permanent residency in Australia or be applying for a visa to live in Australia permanently
- Not be applying for another long term Australia Award unless they have resided outside of Australia for twice the length of the total time that they were in Australia
- They must have completed a tertiary level qualification at least equivalent to an Australian Bachelor's degree.

How to Prepare

In order to be applying for AAS, applicants must:

- Select preferred courses carefully. Applicants will not be able to change the course that they have selected except in exceptional circumstances. The course must have a clear link to the applicant's prior experience and support the applicant to contribute to development outcomes on their return to Sri Lanka.
- Submit a complete application with all necessary attachments, before the deadline. Late and incomplete applications will not be considered.

How to Apply

Online Applications

We strongly advise applicants to apply online and to do so well before the closing date. The online application facility (OASIS) experiences peak usage in the days

leading up to the closing date and applicants may experience delays. Apply online at: https://oasis.dfat.gov.au/

• Supporting documents

Applicants must submit their application with all of the relevant supporting documents listed in the Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook.

• All documents must be certified

If the document is not in English, the translated copy must be certified. See the Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook for certification requirements.

Required Documentation

The following documentation must be submitted by all AAS applicants at the time of application. Failure to provide these documents at the time of application will result in the applicant being deemed ineligible.

Information sessions for potential applicants will be scheduled during the application period.

Applicants must complete their application online on or before the deadline of 11.59 pm. (AEST) 30th April 2019.

Applicants who are awarded scholarships at the end of the selection process will be required to submit a valid Police Clearance Certificate at the time of visa application. Public sector applicants who are selected for an Australia Award Scholarship must also submit the "ERD form 2" once they are selected.
