#### TRADE AND PUBLIC HEALTH WORKSHOP

#### GENEVA, 11-15 NOVEMBER 2019

The WTO Secretariat, in close collaboration with the Secretariats of the World Health Organization (WHO) and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), is organizing the 6th Workshop on Trade and Public Health, scheduled to take place in Geneva from 11 to 15 November 2019. The Workshop builds on a series of annual Workshops on Intellectual Property and Public Health that had been organized by the WTO Secretarial since 2005. It will follow the approach developed in the WHO-WIPO-WTO Trilateral Study "Promoting Access to Medical Technologies and Innovation: Intersections between Public Health, Intellectual Property and Trade" (available on https://www.wto.org/english/rcs\_c/publications\_e/who-wipo-wto\_2013\_c.htm).

#### The Workshop

The Workshop aims to improve the capacity of policymakers to analyse policy choices at the intersection between trade, intellectual property (IP) and public health; to enhance the capacity to address cross-sectoral issues; and to foster smooth domestic coordination. The overall objective is to develop a comprehensive understanding of overlapping policy issues with bearing on public health and encourage the analysis of their relationship with multilateral trade agreements. The programme will on innovation and access to medical technologies, as well as wider trade and health-related policy issues.

The activity is envisaged for policymakers who already have a high-level practical understanding of some aspects of trade, IP and health policy, and who have continuing responsibilities for assessing and implementing trade and IP policy options that relate to public health matters. Participants will be guided by experts to strengthen several practical skills: assessing policy options; analysing and implementing trade agreements; accessing and using related information; and, streamlining trade and health policy into domestic legislative and institutional frameworks. Participants will have ample opportunity to exchange views and experiences with each other, with WHO, WIPO and WTO experts, with representatives from other international organizations, as well as from industry and civil society.

An outline of the programme is enclosed. Given the range and complexity of topics to be covered, the daily schedule for this activity is remarkably intense and demanding. Participants will be asked to engage in a full week of interactive sessions, which will require considerable preparation beforehand and exclusive focus during the week's programme to achieve the expected benefits.

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#### **Invitation to Propose Candidates**

Members and Observers to the WTO, eligible to benefit from training and technical cooperation activities, are invited to nominate up to three capital-based officials of whom one would be possibly selected for this Workshop. The WTO will finance thirty participants (i.e., provision of a return economy-class ticket, terminal expenses and daily subsistence allowance, and accommodation for the duration of the activity). There is also provision for up to five additional applicants to participate in the workshop at their own expense.

To be considered for their possible selection, nominees should possess the following qualifications and background:

- Direct responsibility for matters relating to the interaction between trade agreements and public health, whether from authorities responsible for foreign affairs, trade, IP, public health or from other relevant government entity working on the interface between trade agreements and public health;
- Definite expectation of continuing to work, or being assigned responsibilities, specifically in this field;
- Established expertise and experience in this area, and a good level of knowledge about trade law and policy, including, but not limited to, the WTO's TRIPS Agreement, and public health policy;
- Successful completion of online or face-to-face training activities delivered by the WHO,
   WIRO and/or the WTO on the subjects of the Workshop; and
- All-round proficiency in English, as the Workshop will be delivered in English.

#### The Application Process

The application process consists of the following steps:

- Interested candidates need to duly complete and submit the online application form, which
  is available at <a href="https://wto.formstack.com/forms/2019">https://wto.formstack.com/forms/2019</a> trade and public health workshop.
- 2. The online application form requires uploading a scanned copy of the passport and of the official nomination letter, signed and stamped by the competent government authority that is nominating the candidate. A template for such a letter to be signed and stamped by the national authority can be found annexed to this invitation letter.
- The application form, including the passport and nomination letter, should be submitted via the online application system <u>NO LATER THAN FRIDAY 14 JUNE 2019</u>.

Please note that the complex substantive preparations and logistical arrangements for this activity mean that the WTO Secretariat cannot consider any applications received after that date, nor any applications not validated by the Permanent Mission/Embassy to the WTO.

Selected participants will receive confirmation directly. Relevant administrative information, travel details and economic-class ticket will be sent after the selection has taken place.

The WTO Secretariat reserves the right to postpone or cancel the activity if sufficient funding cannot be secured in time, or in the event of any other circumstances beyond its control.

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#### Preparations for the Workshop

Advance reading material will be made available online to enable selected participants to prepare for the Workshop. They will also be required to submit, in advance of the activity, a brief report on the state of play of policy development regarding issues at the crossroad between trade and public health in their country. This report should cover, in particular, the public health situation, any specific policies or strategies developed to address public health needs, the relevant legislative framework, including the regulatory framework and the implementation and use of flexibilities in the IP system, as well as any relevant experiences. It should also identify and elaborate on a particular topical area of current policy discussion and activity in their country. This preparatory work, ideally assembled in close coordination with key domestic stakeholders, is important to ensure that substantive input can be provided for discussions at the Workshop. Selected participants will be invited to present on their reports to the workshop, so as further to promote interactivity, open discussions and a practical focus on contemporary policy challenges.

#### TRADE AND PUBLIC HEALTH WORKSHOP

Organized by the WTO Secretariat in collaboration with the Secretariats of WHO and WIPO

Geneva, 11-15 November 2019

Venue: Room E, Centre William Rappard

The Workshop will review the system of multilateral trade agreements as part of the wider action to address public health needs. The programme will focus on innovation and access to medical technologies. It will cover: public health determinants; the IP system; pricing and procurement policies; competition policy and rules; tariffs, quotas and licensing; health services; and regulatory issues, including approval, quality control and effectiveness of medicines, the protection of clinical trial data under the TRIPS Agreement, and health-related measures in the TBT and SPS Committees.

Specific sessions dedicated cross-cutting themes linking trade agreements to topical Issues: Antimicrobial Resistance; and Impact of and Access to Medical Technologies. Exercises and case studies will require participants to examine key thematic issues that involve: the consideration of industrial policy, including local production of medicines and technology transfer; the use of IP flexibilities to procure medicines; the application of competition policy; and the addressing specific trade concerns regarding TBT/SPS measures.

Special attention will be given to the topic "Effectively Using Special Compulsory Licences for Export as a Procurement Tool for Medicines". Since the entry into force of the Protocol Amending the TRIPS Agreement, in January 2017, this public health flexibility is an integral part of the TRIPS Agreement. The Workshop will look at how best to effectively use this tool, as well as the practical options for securing access to affordable medicines.
