Australian Awards Scholarships (AAS) - Intake for Academic Year 2021

The Government of Australia has invited applications from eligible government officials in Sri Lanka for the above scholarship programme for the academic year 2021. A copy of the country profile is attached herewith for your information.

The objective of the AAS is to enhance and strengthen the capacity of human resources in the public sector by providing valuable knowledge, skills and qualifications and thereby improving the quality services for the general public while enhancing the economic growth of Sri Lanka. Scholarships are awarded on condition that participants should actively engage in development activities of Sri Lanka. It is also necessary to ensure that the development plans are implemented by them upon their return.

Eligibility Criteria

Australia Awards applicants must meet all eligibility requirements detailed in the Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook, available at:

In addition to these basic eligibility requirements, applicants must also meet the following country specific conditions.

- be a citizen of Sri Lanka
- An IELTS (Academic) score of at least 6.5 or higher (with no individual band score
 of less than 6.0) or an equivalent TOEFL or PTE score. Scores must be valid at 1st
 January 2021.

Applicants working in the priority districts, and applicants with a disability or those
in the disability sector will be considered with an overall IELTS band score of at least
6.0 with no band less than 5.0 (or equivalent TOEFL or PTE score)

If offered an Australia Awards scholarship, they must meet the English language requirements of IELTS 6.5 equivalent before commencing study.

- They must have at least 3 years post qualification experience in the public sector with 2 years in a field relevant to the proposed course of study and be confirmed in their current positions.
- They must have completed a tertiary level qualification at least equivalent to an Australian Bachelor's degree.
- They must have an academic or professional background relevant to their proposed study programme.

How to Prepare

In order to be applying for AAS, applicants must:

Select preferred courses carefully. Applicants will not be able to change the course that
they have selected except in exceptional circumstances. The course must have a clear
link to the applicant's prior experience and support the applicant to contribute to
development outcomes on their return to Sri Lanka.

How to Apply

Online Applications

Applicants are strongly advised to apply online and to do so well before the closing date. The online application facility (OASIS) experiences peak usage in the days leading up to the closing date and applicants may experience delays. Apply online at: https://oasis.dfat.gov.au/

Level of study

Australia Awards scholarships provide citizens of Sri Lanka with the opportunity to obtain a qualification at an Australian tertiary institution.

Awards will be offered for commencement in 2021 within the following allocations:

· Masters level qualification (by coursework or research)

Australia Awards Benefits

Australia Awards scholarships are offered for the minimum period necessary for the individual to complete the academic program specified by the Australian education institution, including any preparatory training.

Scholarship recipients will receive the following:

- · return air travel
- · a one-off establishment allowance on arrival
- full tuition fees
- contribution to living expenses

- introductory academic program
- overseas student health cover for the duration of scholarship
- supplementary academic support,
- fieldwork allowance for research students and masters by coursework which has a compulsory fieldwork component.

Eligibility criteria

Australia Awards applicants must meet all eligibility requirements detailed in the Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook, available at: dfat.gov.au/about-us/publications/Pages/australia-awards-scholarships-policy-handbook.aspx

English language proficiency

Applicants must have achieved an IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5 or higher (with no individual band score of less than 6.0) or an equivalent TOEFL or PTE score. Scores must be valid at 1 January 2021.

Commencement of study

All scholarships must be taken up in the year for which are awarded. Should an awardee not be able to commence study in 2021, the scholarship will be withdrawn.

Country-specific conditions

In addition to the eligibility requirements, candidates from Sri Lanka must also meet the following conditions:

 applicants working in the priority districts, and applicants with a disability or those working in the disability sector will be considered with an overall IELTS band score of at least 6.0 with no band less than 5.0 (or equivalent TOEFL or PTE score).

If offered an Australia Awards scholarship, these applicants must meet the English language requirements of IELTS 6.5 equivalent before commencing study.

- be employed and the following criteria must be confirmed by an employment letter:
 - applicants from the public sector must have at least 3 years' post qualification experience in the public sector with 2 years in a field relevant to the proposed course of study and be confirmed in their current positions.
 - applicants from the private sector and civil society organisation must have at least 3 years' post qualification experience in a field relevant to the proposed course of study.
- have completed a tertiary-level qualification at least equivalent to an Australian Bachelor degree.
- have an academic or professional background relevant to their proposed study program.
- public sector employees selected for an Australia Award scholarship will be required to provide a copy of their official leave approval document to the Australia Awards office prior to departure.

 awardees are required to return to Sri Lanka for at least two years after completing their scholarship, to contribute to economic and social development of the country. Failure to do so will incur a debt to the Commonwealth of Australia for the total value of the scholarship.

Scholarships will not be available for courses of study in Australia where the applicant has already achieved that qualification and the qualification is deemed to be equivalent to the Australian qualification.

Australia Awards Scholarships program will request recognition of prior learning for all scholarship recipients from Sri Lanka. If this request is granted, the recipient may be placed in a degree program that may be shorter in duration than what they have originally applied for.

Opening date: 1 February 2020

Closing date: 30 April 2020 (11:59pm Canberra Time)

Applications and/or supporting documents received after this date will not be considered.

The selection process

- Applications will be shortlisted after eligibility checking.
- Only shortlisted candidates will be contacted.

- The selection process includes an interview. Applicants will be assessed against the following criteria:
 - academic competence
 - potential outcome, including contribution to development outcomes in Sri Lanka
 - professional and personal leadership attributes.
- Successful candidates will be notified no later than 31 August 2020.

Preparatory training

Successful applicants will be required to attend:

- · course counselling
- · pre-departure briefing
- · university's Introductory Academic Program
- · other required preparatory study on arrival in Australia.
