Introduction:

The World Health Organization (WHO) Country Office has collaborated with Ministry of Health and other key stakeholders in strengthening the health systems in Sri Lanka, in line with the 13th General Programme of Work -13 (GPW 13) 2019-2023, regional flagship priorities and Sustainable Development Goals.

In keeping with the strategic directions of the organization, WHO Country Office (WCO) is seeking a National Consultant to assist in the implementation of the Human Resources for Health workplan

under the "Working for Health" program funded by China-UN Peace and Development Fund. The successful candidate will play a key role in implementing and monitoring the HRH workplan and effectively integrate the interventions under the health system strengthening and universal health coverage activities of WHO. The areas of work will contribute to achieving the first billion on UHC, particularly in the area of strengthening human resources in Sri Lanka, by stepping up WHO's role in convening and engaging multisectoral partners to achieve the SDGs.

Job Description:

Under the guidance of the Public Health Administrator and day to day supervision of NPO HSPE the SSA will:

- Support to strengthen institutional capacity for human resource policy and strategic planning, including mechanisms to coordinate an intersectoral health workforce agenda through the HRH Technical Advisory Group of MOH
- Facilitate the development and implementation of health workforce policies and strategies to address major human resource gaps in the country in line with the goal of UHC and health security;
- Coordinate the work with ILO and MOH on strengthening mechanisms to deliver mutual benefits and
 mitigate the consequences arising from health workforce mobility and migration, including bilateral
 and regional cooperation and the implementation of the WHO Global Code of Practice on the
 International Recruitment of Health Personnel, and establishment of social dispute settlement
 mechanism for Sri Lanka;
- Coordinating and updating of National Health Workforce Accounts (NHWA) and advocate its use for policy decisions;
- Assist in developing and implementing strategies to align health workforce education with health system needs and the PHC reorganization, including standardization of basic training programmes for Ministry of Health training institutions;
- Assist in improving the capacity of health workforce in implementing the Patient Safety and Healthcare Quality Strategic plan and the action plan for – Sri Lanka;
- Performing any other related duties assigned by the supervisor as and when required which includes; Drafting of necessary technical reports and documents as per requirements of the Organization, and to assist in preparation, organization and following-up of WHO-organized meetings
- · Submit an assignment report upon completion of assignment.
